Training Sessions will be one full day with a break for lunch on your own. Meeting locations and times will be announced approximately six to eight weeks prior to the scheduled training.

Most downtown development projects involve federal and/or state funding, which means MainStreet managers and municipal staff need to comply with federal and state historic preservation laws and regulations. This one-day training will eliminate confusion about how and when to comply and will provide participants with the tools and knowledge to successfully move their projects forward. The training will include presentations, small group exercises, discussion and questions and answers.

- The importance of historic preservation in downtown revitalization;
- Basic understanding of historic preservation law;
- Basic principles, players and process of Section 106;
- The Cultural Properties Review process and compliance; and
- How to address historic preservation issues as you design projects in your community.

Attendance at one of the four regional trainings is mandatory for all FY12 MainStreet Capital Outlay Fund Grant Applicants with a registered or pending downtown historic district or for projects that affect an individually listed historic resource. All grant awards subject to this requirement will be conditional until the MainStreet Manager and a City representative responsible for the project's management attend one the trainings listed above. If this requirement is not met, the conditional grant award will be rescinded and awarded to the next highest scoring proposal. William A. Dodge, Ph. D. will be presenting this training for NMMS. Dr. Dodge is a cultural historian with more than 35 years experience in archaeological, anthropological, and historical research with a demonstrated ability to conceptualize, implement, and successfully complete a variety of historic preservation projects. He has guided clients through Section 106 consultation with SHPOs in California, Arizona, New Mexico, and Texas. As part of his duties in working for the federal government, Dr. Dodge meets the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for architectural historian, historian, and archaeologist.

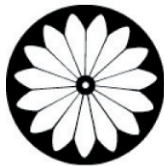
