New Mexico MainStreet Awards Certification to Seven MainStreet Leaders

Eleven NM Communities Represented in Certified Executive Directors, Fundraising and Grantwriting Graduates

Carlsbad, N.M. – Today, New Mexico MainStreet (NMMS) announced seven MainStreet leaders have earned Executive Director Certification, marking the completion of a comprehensive training and skills development process. Certification is granted to affiliated NMMS leaders who successfully complete training on the *Main Street Approach™*, fundraising, and grantwriting. Training is led by NMMS Revitalization Specialists and covers topics such as nonprofit management, volunteer & small business development, the creative economy, property redevelopment, historic preservation, placemaking, event management, promotion, and branding.

"By completing New Mexico MainStreet's Certification program, MainStreet leaders solidify their role as community economic developers because the program prepares them to lead their district's revitalization efforts. Main Street America's Main Street Approach™ is a time-tested framework used for community-driven revitalization. The Approach™ incorporates the four broad areas of Economic Vitality, Design, Organization, and Promotion (known as the Four Points) to implement Transformation Strategies.
