SELF-GUIDED TOUR Explore Eddy County Courthouse

Completed in 1892, the Eddy County Courthouse was built in the gothic revival style of locally made brick, costing \$30,000. Since that time, the Courthouse has changed significantly and today features many points of interest the casual observer might not see on first glance. Let's explore!



SOUTH SIDE OF THE EDDY COUNTY COURTHOUSE 200 Block of W. Mermod St.

In 1939, a Courthouse remodel was completed utilizing \$112,500 in Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works (WPA) funds as well as WPA labor. Costing \$184,000 in total, the remodel converted the Courthouse from its Victorian architecture to the Spanish Pueblo Revival style you see before you today.

GAZEBO ON THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF COURTHOUSE LAWN 200 Block of W. Mermod St.

In 1910, the County Commission authorized spending \$70 to construct a bandstand on the Courthouse lawn. On Sunday afternoons, citizens would gather to listen to local musicians or the fire department band. While that bandstand is long gone, Carlsbad MainStreet secured funding in 2020 to construct a new gazebo to provide a shady place to relax and enjoy downtown activities.

"GREETINGS FROM CARLSBAD" MURAL Northeast Corner of Courthouse Complex · 200 Block of W. Stevens St.

> Inspired by a blank wall and a vintage postcard, the "Greetings from Carlsbad" mural was conceptualized and implemented by the Pearl of the Pecos Arts & Cultural District and muralist Michael Fish in 2021. The mural pays homage to the original postcard, while incorporating aspects of Carlsbad today and creative elements from the artist.





PIONEER PLAZA North side of the Courthouse · 200 Block of W. Stevens St.

After discovering a water well under a parking lot during a Courthouse complex remodel, a Pueblo-style portico with a simulated river utilizing the water well was built in 2002 and named Pioneer Plaza. Engraved pavers with Carlsbad-area pioneer family names were cemented around the perimeter of the Plaza. A red sandstone cornerstone, salvaged by Leonard Beauford during the 1938 demolition of the original 1892 courthouse, was donated by the Bill Mitchell and Beauford families (Leonard's grandchildren) and permanently affixed to the cement floor in the Plaza near the northeast wall.



CATTLE BRANDS West Side of the Courthouse · 100 Block of N. Canal St.



The Carlsbad region has a long history with ranching, with the famous Goodnight-Loving cattle trail, established in 1866, running along the Pecos River from Texas to Wyoming. In the 1880s, ranching was the number one source of income for area residents, before 35 percent of all cattle in the region perished during the "Big Die" from 1884-1886, resulting in a shift in economic focus to agriculture. In the 1940s, the cattle brands of Eddy County and the region were etched onto the west and south entrances to the Courthouse, where you can find them today.






The Carlsbad library offers several long, beamsupported awnings that form a built-in frame to direct attention to the subject as the focal point and provide beautiful indirect lighting.

> **TRINITY HOTEL & RESTAURANT** 201 S. Canal Street



Start your tasty tour at Trinity Hotel Restaurant designated a National Historic Landmark in 1965. The former First National Bank of El Paso red-brick building also once housed the area's first newspaper and the office of Sheriff Pat Garrett who famously shot Billy the Kid. Now a bustling restaurant, wine shop and espresso bar, the Trinity is a great example of

respecting the past while creating a promising future. -- 🎗





This down home, dusky bar & grill (think steaks, margaritas and beer) is all in with the Lucky Bull theme both inside and out. Housed in Carlsbad's Old Town Hall, a life sized copper bull sculpture emerges from the flowers to greet you by the front door.



MILTON'S BREWERY 213 W. Mermod

You just might run into Jameson Lucas, Carlsbad's unofficial historian & co-founder of the original Milton's before it moved to the Odd Fellows building in 2018. The entire façade of this art deco structure built in 1906 is covered in cool teal and gold exterior tiles.

FARMERS & MARKERS MARKET 201 Mermod Street

Established in 2007, the weekly market, third Thursdays at 5pm, June-September, features locally grown produce & homemade foods, crafts & goods. Perfect spot for picnic on the lawn of the Historic Courthouse - check out the exhibits, art & outdoor gazebo.



YELLOW BRIX RESTAURANT BEER & WINE 201 N. Canal Street



Relax in the cool shade of the Yellow Brix' Mediterranean-style patio or inside the bright, cheerful restaurant, beer & wine bar. Imagine the many past lives of this inviting restaurant established in 2012, that started out as a private residence & later housed a succession of retail shops and offices.
